# **Up-Dated Guidelines—Killaloe Diocese**

Pastoral Statement to clergy of Killaloe diocese – Bishop Fintan Monahan – March 24th, 2020 **The Sacrament of Baptism**: Following on from the Government announcement limiting social gatherings to a maximum of four people – Except in the case of danger of death Baptisms should be postponed until further notice.

**Pastoral Care of the Elderly and the Sick** (First Friday Calls): On the basis of the public health guidelines, house visits and other pastoral house visits should cease except in the cases of the anointing of those who are seriously or gravely ill (see below). Pastoral visits can be replaced for the time being with other forms of pastoral outreach such as telephone conversations with prayers and blessings

#### The Anointing of Those who are Dying:

Considering the risks and dangers at this present time, it is not expected that priests in parishes will be called upon to anoint someone with Covid-19 in their homes. Anyone seriously ill with Covid-19 will be transferred to hospital & hospital chaplains will follow hospital protocols in anointing such patients.
