Future Reopening of Churches

A discussion was held on the possible reopening of Churches. It was a very difficult decision to take and of course we would all prefer that our Churches would very much be open to the public. The reason we took the decision to close Churches at Provincial level was out of serious concern for the health and safety of Parishioners. Having Churches opened encourages people to leave home and particularly senior citizens, many of whom are cocooned. The argument was put forward that shops etc are opened. However such premises are cleaned commercially along with the regulation and supervision of who is going in and out and we don't have the resources to ensure that along with the necessary level of cleaning required to keep vulnerable people safe. The decision to keep Churches closed was reaffirmed by the Council of Priests. This of course will be reviewed following the next phase of guidelines on May 5th. Many thanks for your kind cooperation with this.

"GROW" Mental Health Recovery

We have set up a six-week programme designed to help people look after their mental health during the current crisis. The initiative is entitled 'Creating Hope and Staying Positive while facing Covid-19' and is now on our website at https://grow.ie/category/covid-19-support/.

The idea is that we are facing the reality that this is a long-term process and we need advice that will sustain us over the coming weeks. The content, which includes podcasts, relaxations techniques and practical tasks, is designed to be relevant, reassuring and fun.

But there does not have to be loneliness. Yes there is panic buying. But there does not have to be meanness. Yes there is sickness. But there does not have to be disease of the soul Yes there is even death. But there can always be a rebirth of love. Wake to the choices you make as to how to live now. Today, breathe. Listen, behind the factory noises of your panic The birds are singing again The sky is clearing, Spring is coming, And we are always encompassed by Love. Open the windows of your soul And though you may not be able to touch across the empty square, Sing.
