Baptised and Sent – Irish Church Synodal Pathway

“St Paul reminds the early Christian community that baptism unites them to the saving death of Christ and enables them to share his life: “You have been taught that when we were baptised in Christ Jesus we were baptised in his death; in other words, when we were baptised, we went into the tomb with him and joined him in death, so that as Christ was raised from the dead by the Father’s glory, we too might live a new life” (6:3-4). When baptism was celebrated during the Easter Vigil, as it was for many centuries, this connection between the paschal mystery and the new life given in baptism was readily made.”

Gracious God, we thank you for journeying with us and for all that has been shared. Help us to remember that we are all Baptised and Sent and give us the courage and energy to make a difference in our world. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Pope Leo’s Lenten Message Continued

In this week’s excerpt from Pope Leo’s Lenten Message Pope Leo gives us very practical examples as to how we can fast – not from food but from harsh words and rash judgement and in doing so we might feast in kindness, respect and care.

In this regard, I would like to invite you to a very practical and frequently unappreciated form of abstinence: that of refraining from words that offend and hurt our neighbour. Let us begin by disarming our language, avoiding harsh words and rash judgement, refraining from slander and speaking ill of those who are not present and cannot defend themselves. Instead, let us strive to measure our words and cultivate kindness and respect in our families, among our friends, at work, on social media, in political debates, in the media and in Christian communities. In this way, words of hatred will give way to words of hope and peace.
